

# MY ZESTA STORY

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LOCATION:

A HOTEL, NESTLED AMIDST STUNNING TEA ESTATES, OFFERING A PICTURESQUE VIEW.

FRAME 1



The camera begins by focusing on the front yard of the hotel, where a young woman is painting a beautiful landscape of a tea estate. She has just started working on her painting. FRAME 2

FRAME 5



The camera focuses on the front yard, in a different day. A "Zesta" tea packet is on the table near the drawing board, and the finished painting shows the violinist playing in the middle of a tea estate. The young man is in the front yard (he came to place the tea cup as usual), but the woman is not in the garden. He, with the tea cup in hand, glances at the tea packet and the finished painting. At that moment, he hears the "Zesta" sound from behind.

FRAME 6



The camera turns as the young man turns to find the sound. Where the female painter stands, smiling at the man. The woman (who made the "Zesta" sound) is holding a cup of tea in one hand and a spoon in the other, while the man is holding a cup of tea in both hands. The man looks happy and surprised, while the woman smiles lovingly and says, "Zesta."

# Notes:

- The characters, a painter and a violinist, are introduced to illustrate that tea is not just a drink but a form of art.
- The progress in the painting in frames 3 and 4 indicates that the violinist secretly keeps the tea cup during the entire period while the painter continues her painting.
- The "Zesta" tea packet on the table in the 5th frame shows that the taste of "Zesta" is unmatched and can be recognized.
- Overall, the story aims to show that "Zesta" is a form of art and a way of expressing love.
